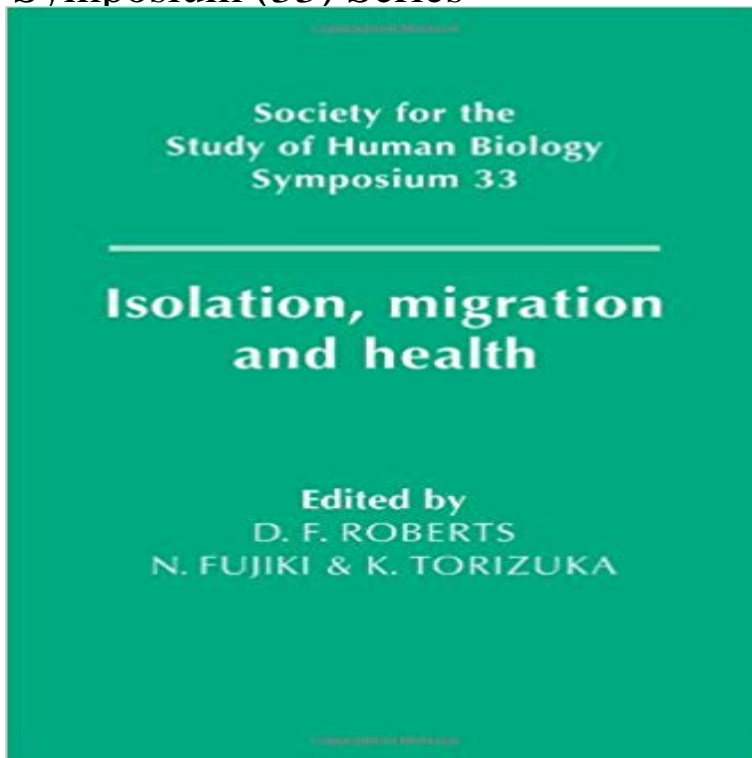


Isolation, Migration and Health Society for the Study of Human Biology Symposium (33) Series
