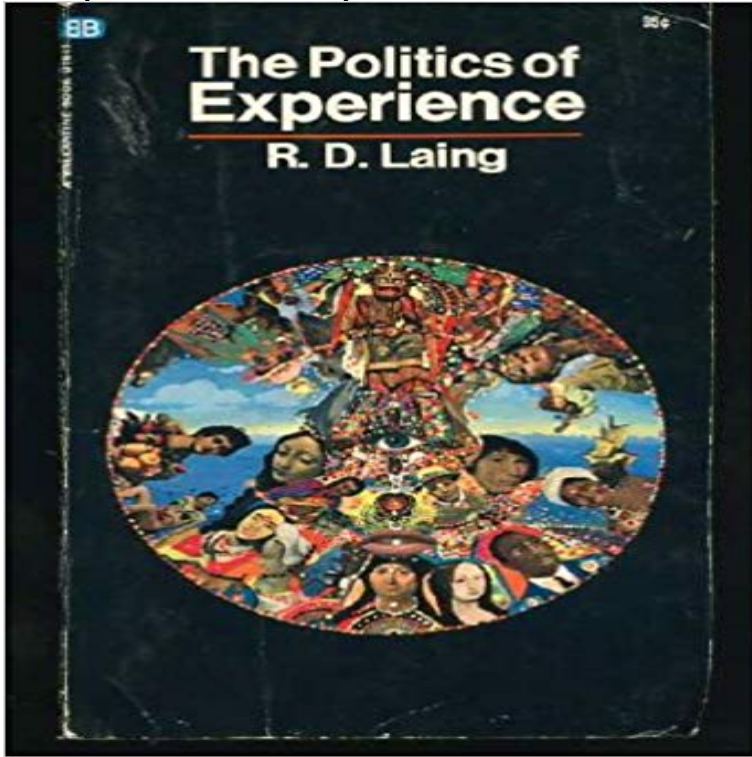

Although he never considered himself an anti-psychiatrist, Laing has been called the most influential and iconic of the anti-psychiatrists of the 1960s and 1970s.
